



Skin City's Policy for Piercing Minors:

Laws regarding the piercing of minors vary by location. In the United States, the legal age of consent is 18 years of age. Until then a minor's body is the legal responsibility his or her parent(s) or legal guardian(s). Additionally, any contract (such as a release form) signed by a minor is not legally binding unless it is also signed by the person legally responsible for her/him. We here at Skin City Tattoo and Body Piercing LLC require a parent or legal guardian must be present to sign a consent form and be in the building for the piercing procedure. The written parental or legal guardian consent must be submitted to the licensee by the parent or legal guardian prior to piercing the minor. The consenting parent or legal guardian must be 18 years of age and present government issued photographic identification at time of written consent. A copy of the government issued photographic identification must be included in the client record: or If the client is an emancipated minor, copies of legal court documents proving emancipation and government issued photographic identification is required

With a signed release, minors are eligible for consideration for the following piercings:

- Earlobe(s) or Ear Cartilage
- Navel
- Oral/Facial
- Nostril
- Eyebrow

We reserve the right to refuse to pierce anyone under the age of 18.

We reserve the right to refuse to pierce any child who is too young to consent or comprehend the piercing procedure and its consequences. A baby is unable to follow verbal or written instructions to care for a piercing. Particularly with infants and toddlers, the body (including the earlobes) and immune system are still developing.
